Three suspects arrested following aggravated battery at Casey's

Nally accused of intentionally crashing truck into victims' vehicle on Saturday

ARKANSAS CITY, Kan. (February 11, 2016) — An Arkansas City man has been arrested in connection with an aggravated battery Saturday morning at a local convenience store in which he is accused of intentionally ramming another vehicle with the pickup truck he was driving.

Two other people also were arrested Thursday morning while the suspect was being apprehended.

Sean Michael Nally, 21, of Arkansas City, was arrested by the Arkansas City Police Department at 1520 N. Seventh St. on a Cowley County District Court warrant for criminal damage to property, criminal threat, disorderly conduct and two counts of aggravated battery.

He was transported to and booked into the Cowley County Jail in Winfield in lieu of \$20,000 bond through Arkansas City district court. Nally remained in custody at the time of this release.

Additionally, Garrett Thomas Wells, 18, and Jenny Ann O'Donnell, 18, both of Arkansas City, were arrested at the same address on suspicion of obstruction of the legal process. Both O'Donnell and Wells were transported to the county jail in lieu of \$2,000 bond through Arkansas City district court.

Officers responded about 11:10 a.m. Saturday to Casey's General Store, 601 S. Summit St., for a vehicle accident. They learned that two juvenile females had been the victims in the incident.

Two adult males were in a 1997 Nissan pickup truck that reportedly had rammed the back of the females' vehicle on purpose as a result of an ongoing property dispute.

Nally then exited the truck and allegedly began to yell at the females before fleeing the scene on foot. The vehicle was left unattended in the store's parking lot.

Police also learned that prior to the incident at Casey's, Nally also had made alleged threats of bodily harm to a third juvenile female.
